


How to use the ringsize meter:

- 1 Read the contents of the page carefully before printing.
- 2 Cut out the ringsize meter and make sure to also cut the slit on the large part of the meter (----0).
- 3 Slide the pointed tip into the slit making sure that the coloured side is facing outwards.
- 4 Slide the ringsize meter over the desired finger at the first phalanx and pull the pointed tip until it fits around.
- 5 Read the number visible at the slit which corresponds to your finger's circumference in millimeters and continue to page 2, if you wish.
- 6 The table on page 2 features circles with two numbers:
 - a) the number inside the circle corresponds to the circumference
 - b) the number underneath the circle indicates its diameter. You can use this page to identify the size of a simple ring band laying it flat over the corresponding circle.

Note: The achieved measures are indicative. KB can not be held responsible for possible measuring mistakes.




In order to verify that the ringsize meter was printed correctly, please measure with a ruler the design to the right. It should be exactly 2 centimeters long.
